

I'VE BEEN ACCEPTED, NOW WHAT?

What will The PhD Project do to help me once I begin my doctoral program?

Once accepted into a full-time, accredited business doctoral program, students who meet the eligibility requirements are invited to join The PhD Project Students Associations (DSAs). These associations were created in 1994 by The PhD Project to sustain a high level of commitment and a sense of connection among minority business doctoral students. There are now five minority doctoral students associations covering all the major areas of business education: Accounting, Finance & Economics, Information Systems & Sciences, Management and Marketing. What are the eligibility criteria?

- Must be Black/African American, Latinx/Hispanic American, or Native American
- Must be a United States citizen, permanent resident (possess a green card) or DACA recipient, or Jay Treaty-eligible
- Must be admitted/enrolled in an AACSB qualified business PhD program in the United States or Canada

What are benefits:

- Access to over 1,700 minority faculty and doctoral students
- Access to Journal editors
- Access to mentorship by PhD Project faculty
- Fully funded attendance to DSA conference and professional association conference of your discipline including registration fees to attend professional association conference.

As an invited member, The PhD Project will pay for your round-trip airfare (domestic travel only), and your hotel stay for 4 nights to cover The PhD Project DSA conference and the professional association conference.
